



You are personally responsible for making sure that your washer...

- is installed by a qualified installer.
- is properly installed and leveled on a floor that can support the weight.*
- is connected to the right kind of outlet, electric supply, water supply and drain.*
- is properly grounded.*
- is used only for jobs normally expected of home automatic washers.
- is properly maintained.
- is protected from the weather and kept where the temperature will not fall below freezing.
- is not run by children or anyone unable to operate it properly.

Safety first

ALWAYS unplug the power supply cord before attempting to service the washer.

NEVER put flammable fluids (dry-cleaning solvents, gasoline, kerosene) into your washer. **NEVER** use them near your washer.

ALWAYS hand launder or air dry fabrics treated with flammable fluids before putting them into your washer.

NEVER put your hands into your washer until all motion stops. If the lid is opened while the basket is spinning, the basket will automatically stop in a few seconds.

DO NOT allow children to operate or play with the washer.

ALWAYS store detergent, laundry aids and other materials in a cool, dry place where children can't reach them – in a locked cabinet, if possible.

ALWAYS read and follow instructions on packages or detergent and laundry aids – especially warnings and precautions.

HAZARDOUS FUMES can be formed if chlorine bleach is used in the same wash as ammonia or acids such as vinegar or rust remover.

DO NOT machine wash glass fiber materials. Small particles can stick to fabrics washed in following loads and cause skin irritation.

SPECIAL CAUTION: If hot water has not been used recently (usually two weeks or longer), explosive hydrogen gases may build up in the water heater and hot water pipes. To prevent injury or damage, turn on all hot water faucets and allow to run for several minutes. This will allow gases to escape. Do not smoke or use any open flame near the faucet while it is open.

Starting your washer


Before starting your washer:



- 1. Measure and add detergent.
- 2. Place sorted load in washer.
- 3. Start washer.




Select a 1. WATER LEVEL



- Turn the knob to point to a setting that describes the size of the load you want to wash.
- The water level can be set for EX SMALL (a few items), MEDIUM or LARGE (a full load).

NOTE: Use the LARGE water level for best permanent press results.

Select a CYCLE



- Each cycle has preset wash and rinse water temperatures. (See pages 6 & 7 for more information.)
- All rinses are cold.


Recommended wash temperatures can be found in your "Laundry Guide."

IMPORTANT: Use warm water with the PERM'T PRESS or KNITS GENTLE cycles. For heavily soiled permanent press or knit clothes, pre-wash or pre-soak before washing in warm water.

LOAD SIZES AND WATER LEVELS


For best cleaning results, the load must be able to move freely in the water. Too big a load or too little water can cause wear or tearing of load items.

*Approximate fill with load.




CAUTION: DO NOT OVERLOAD WASHER.


LARGE (17.3 gals./65.5 L)*

EX SMALL (9.5 gals./36.0 L)*




3. Start the washer




A. Push in the Timer Knob and turn it to the right. It must be pushed in and turned only clockwise.



- For REGULAR and PERM'T PRESS cycles, turn the Timer Knob to the START line.
- For the KNITS GENTLE cycle, turn the Timer Knob to the *.
- Start the washer by pulling out the Timer Knob.



B. After starting the washer, it will fill to the level you set with wash water of the preset temperature. After finishing the entire cycle, the Timer Knob will move into the OFF area.




C. To stop the washer at any time, push in the Timer Knob. To restart the washer, pull out the Timer Knob.

What happens in each cycle

Each cycle has been designed for different kinds of fabrics.

When a Cycle Selector Button is pushed and the Timer Control Knob pulled out, the washer fills before agitation and timing starts. After agitation starts, the Timer Knob turns clockwise until it points to OFF and the cycle ends.

REGULAR Cycles



REGULAR (HOT WASH)


A cycle with a hot water wash and cold water rinse for sturdily constructed fabrics that are heavily soiled.

REGULAR (WARM WASH)


A cycle with a warm water wash and cold water rinse for sturdily constructed fabrics that are moderately soiled.

REGULAR (COLD WASH)

A cycle with a cold water wash and rinse for sturdily constructed items that are lightly soiled.



PERMANENT PRESS Cycle




A cycle with a warm water wash and cold water rinse. This cycle has **cool down** rinse which helps keep wrinkles from setting into permanent press and some synthetic fabrics.

FILL to Selected Level




WASH 4 Minutes Low Speed


KNITS GENTLE Cycle



A cycle with a warm water wash and cold water rinse that gently washes and spins delicate items and washable knits.




NOTE: You may hear the sound of water spraying during the spin parts of some cycles. I some cycles, cold water is sprayed on the spinning load to help with the rinsing.



IMPORTANT: THE WASHER WILL PAUSE BRIEFLY THROUGHOUT EACH CYCLE. These pauses are normal. They allow for the reversing of the motor, normal washer operations, and cool down portion of the PERMANENT PRESS Cycle.


Other operating instructions



For a rinse and spin

You may need an extra rinse and spin for heavily soiled loads which need more detergent. (Extra detergent can require an extra rinse.)

- Push Timer Knob in.
- Turn clockwise to the Rinse portion of the cycle. **See above drawing.**
- Pull Timer Knob out.
- The washer will fill to selected level; agitate 2 minutes; drain and spin.



For a drain and spin

Your washer can be set to drain and spin out water.

- Push Timer Knob in.
- Turn clockwise to the second Drain portion of the cycle. See above drawing.
- Pull Timer Knob out.
- The washer will drain and spin.

For agitation and spin speeds in each cycle, see pages 6 and 7.

MAGIC CLEAN® lint filter

The lint filter in your washer cleans itself. Collected lint is drained away with the wash and rinse water. If your washer drains into a tub, remove any lint collected in the drain or strainer






Caring for your washer



WHEN NOT WASHING, keep both water faucets turned off. This takes the pressure off the water inlet valve and hoses.



REMOVE SHARP OBJECTS such as pins, buckles, etc., from clothes before washing. Close metal zippers.




NEVER USE THE WASHER TO...

- store wet or dry laundry.
- soak for more than 2 hours.
- soak with chlorine bleach.
- soak with vinegar or other acids.
- soak or store urine soaked clothes.



AFTER WASHING, use a soft dry cloth to wipe the outside and inside dry. Leave the lid up until the basket is dry. **Wipe up spills right away.** Spills can dull or damage the finish.



SHARP OR HEAVY OBJECTS should never be put on or in the washer. Check pockets for bolts, nuts, tools, etc.




some pretreatment products can damage washer and dryer dials, consoles and finishes. Do not use these products on or near your washer or dryer.

Winterizing

Because some water stays in the washer, freezing can cause a lot of damage. If your washer is **stored or moved** during the cold weather...




 Shut off both water faucets. Disconnect and drain water inlet hoses.




Put a quart of automobile-type antifreeze in the basket.






 Set the washer for a DRAIN and SPIN (see page 8). Let it run for about 30 seconds to mix the antifreeze and water.



To use the washer again...

- 1. Flush water pipes and hoses.
- 2. Connect hoses to the washer.
- 3. Turn on the water faucets.



4. Run the water through a complete cycle with one cup of detergent to clean out the antifreeze.

If you need service or assistance, we suggest you follow these four steps:

1. Before calling for assistance...

Performance problems often result from little things you can find and fix yourself without tools of any kind.

If your washer does not fill:

- Is the power supply cord plugged into a live circuit with the proper voltage?
- Are both faucets open?
- Have you checked your home's main fuses or circuit breaker box?
- Are the water supply hoses kinked?
- Is the Timer Control Knob set and pulled out?

If your washer does not spin?

- Is the lid closed?
- Is the power supply cord plugged into a live circuit with the proper voltage?
- Have you checked your home's main fuses or circuit breaker box?

If your washer stops during a cycle:

 Remember, the washer pauses briefly at different times in each cycle. These pauses are normal.

If your washer fills and drains without running:

 Make sure that the Timer Control Knob is pointing to START or *.

Make sure the drain hose is higher than the water level in the washer. If it isn't...

- The washer may seem to be draining during wash and rinse cycles.
- Water can siphon out. (See "Installation Instructions.")


