




# Please read this Use and Care Guide before you do anything else...

This booklet tells you how to start your freezer, defrost it, clean it, and adjust controls.

Treat your new freezer with care. Use it only to do what chest freezers are designed to do.

- **1. Complete** Model and Serial Numbers (from the plate located as shown.)
- 2. Purchase date from sales invoice.



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# Before you plug it in


## **IMPORTANT**

Before using your freezer, you are personally responsible for making sure that it...

- is installed and levelled on a floor that will hold the weight, and in an area suitable for its size and use.
- is connected only to the right kind of outlet, with the right electrical supply and grounding. (Refer to your "Electrical Requirements and Grounding Instructions.")
- is used only for jobs expected of chest freezers.
- is not near an oven, radiator or other heat source.

- is properly maintained.
- is out of the weather.
- is used in an area where the room temperature will not exceed 110°F (43.3°C).
- is not run where there are explosive fumes.
- is not used by those who may not understand how it should be used.
- is not loaded with food before it has time to get properly cold.

# Install properly...




- 1. Check the strength of the floor. It should hold the weight of a fully loaded freezer.
- 2. Pick a safe place, indoors, away from inflammables such as gasoline.
- 3. Allow at least 3 inches (7.5 cm) air space on all sides of freezer and 2 inches (5 cm) at back. Leave room at top for lid to open all the way.
- 4. It should not be necessary to remove the lid during installation. If, for any reason, the hinges need adjustment, see your authorized service agency.
- 5. Do not cover the freezer with items such as blankets, sheets, tablecloths, etc.

If required by sanitation code, seal the cabinet to the floor with the approved floor seal kit. This kit. (Part No. 702509) can be purchased from your Whirlpool Appliance Dealer or from Whirlpool Corporation, LaPorte Division, 1900 Whirlpool Drive, LaPorte, Indiana 46<u>350.</u>


## Level chest freezer...

from end to end and front to back so that the lid will seal properly.



## Clean it...

Clean your freezer before usina it. See cleanina instructions on page 6.



#### Recommended Grounding Method

A 115 Volt, 60 Hz., AC only 15 or 20 ampere fused and properly grounded electrical supply is required. It is recommended that a separate circuit serving only this appliance be provided. Use a receptacle which cannot be turned off with a switch or pull chain. Do not use an extension cord.

Attach retaining clip over power cord plug from literature package inside the freezer.

# Using your freezer

# Setting the temperature control...

- Insert a coin in the slot of the Temperature Control to turn it.
- Turn control to Number 3. This setting is designed to maintain the temperature at or near 0°F (-17.8°C) under normal operating conditions.



# Adjusting the temperature control...

- Turn control to higher number for colder temperatures.
- 2. Turn to lower number for less cold temperatures.

# Cooling freezer first...

Allow freezer to cool 6 to 8 hours before filling with **frozen food.** 

**NOTE:** When freezer is first started the compressor will run constantly until the cabinet is cooled. It may take up to 6 to 8 hours or longer, depending on room temperature and the number of times the freezer lid is opened.

After the cabinet is cooled the compressor will turn on and off as needed to keep freezer at proper temperature.

# The sliding baskets...


can be moved from side to side or removed when loading or unloading food below it.

#### To remove:

Lift baskets out.

## To replace:

Lower baskets into place.



## The key eject lock...

can help reduce the hazard of child entrapment.



To lock or unlock the freezer you must hold the key in the lock while turning. The lock is spring loaded so the key cannot be left in the lock.

If the key is lost, contact your service agency for a replacement. Always give the **complete** model and serial number of your freezer when requesting a replacement key.

# The signal light...

automatically warns of any unexpected power failure.

If the signal light is not glowing, immediately check:

- for power interruption,
- for an unplugged power cord,
- for a burned out signal light.



#### To replace:

- 1. Unplug power cord from outlet.
- Carefully snap out light cover and assembly with a screwdriver by inserting it under the end of metal edge of the light. Be careful not to chip finish on freezer.
- Unplug burned out signal light and replace with a new one. Signal light can be ordered from your service agency.
- 4. Then, snap light assembly into place.
- 5. Plug power cord into outlet.

## **Energy Saving Tips...**

- Check lid gasket and level cabinet to ensure a good lid seal. Keeping freezer locked ensures lid closure.
- Keep lid openings to a minimum. Remove several items at one time. Keep contents organized to eliminate searching.
- Fill to capacity. Follow recommended procedures for freezing foods.
- Set Temperature Control to provide temperatures around 0°F (-17.8°C). There is no need to store foods below 0°F.
- Do not let frost build up to more than ¼ inch (6 mm) thick.

# **Cleaning your freezer**

This freezer should be cleaned when frost has built up to about ¼ inch (6 mm) thickness. Complete defrosting and cleaning should be done at least once a year. In high humidity areas, a freezer may need more frequent defrosting.

#### To defrost and clean:

- 1. Turn Temperature Control to OFF.
- 2. Unplug freezer.
- 3. Take out all frozen food and sliding baskets.

**NOTE:** Wrap frozen packages in several layers of newspaper and cover with a blanket. Food will stay frozen several hours.

4. Clean freezer according to the following directions.

## Cleaning chart...

Part	What to use	How to clean
Removable parts (baskets)	Sponge or cloth; mild detergent and warm water.	<ul><li>Wash with warm water and a mild detergent.</li><li>Rinse and dry.</li></ul>
Outside	Sponge, cloth or paper towel; mild detergent; appliance wax (or good auto paste wax).	<ul> <li>Wash with warm water and a mild detergent.</li> <li>Do not use abrasive or harsh cleansers.</li> <li>Rinse and dry.</li> <li>Wax painted metal surfaces at least twice a year with appliance wax or a good auto paste wax. Apply wax with a clean, soft cloth.</li> <li>Do not use wax on plastic parts.</li> </ul>

# Shutting off and moving your freezer

## If freezer is shut off for more than 24 hours:

- 1. Remove and store all food.
- 2. Unplug freezer.
- Clean thoroughly. See "Cleaning your freezer," page 6.
- 4. Block lid open for air circulation. Turn lock to locked position with lid open. Place blocks between lid and cabinet and tape in place with self-adhesive filament tape.

## If you move the freezer:

- 1. Remove the sliding baskets.
- Do not place objects inside or on top of cabinet.
- 3. Level properly to ensure good lid seal.

WARNING: Do not allow children near the freezer when the lid is blocked open. They may become injured or trapped.

# If you need service or assistance, we suggest you follow these four steps:

# 1. Before calling for assistance...

Performance problems often result from little things you can find and fix yourself without tools of any kind.

## If electricity goes off:

Learn how long power will be off by calling the power company.

- If service is to be interrupted 24 hours or less, keep freezer closed. Most food will stay frozen.
- If service is to be interrupted longer than 24 hours. do this:
  - 1. Remove all unfrozen food and store in a frozen food locker, OR...
  - 2. Place 2 lbs. (0.9 kg) of dry ice in freezer for every cu. ft. of freezer space. This will keep frozen foods for 2 to 4 days. Wear gloves to protect your hands from dry ice burns.
  - 3. If neither food locker storage or dry ice is available, use or can perishable food at once.
- The length of time food will stay frozen depends on several factors. For instance: a full freezer will remain cold longer than a freezer partially filled. And a freezer full of meat will stay cold longer than a freezer filled with baked goods. Also, if the food still contains ice crystals, it may be safely refrozen, although the quality and flavor may be affected. Use this food as soon as convenient. If the condition of the food is poor or is in any way questionable, it is wise to dispose of it.

## If freezer stops running:

- Check to see if power cord is plugged into the outlet.
- Check fuse box or circuit breaker.
- Check electric company for a power failure.
- Be sure Temperature Control is turned ON.

#### If motor seems to run too long

On hot summer days or if room is hot, motor will run longer to provide correct amount of cooling.

#### If freezer feels warm

During normal operating conditions the freezer transfers heat removed from food packages and air space to the outside room air. The freezer cabinet may feel warm.

## If frost builds up on the trim strip around top of cabinet

- 1. Check the fit of the lid to make sure it is sealing. With the lid closed, press down firmly on the edges or at the center of the lid. This pressure will cause the flexible lid to fit flat against the cabinet and seal.
- 2. Do not open or close the lid by grasping a corner. Use the handle.


